## It's good to talk

I was thrilled to see 97% of year 7 parents come along to the first subject consultation evening last night. It's fantastic to see such great engagement from the newest arrivals at Nailsea and the conversations I had on the door with various people were overwhelmingly positive.

I can appreciate that for parents who have a child going to secondary school for the first time, this style of parents' evening is very different to those experienced at primary school. One of the issues that we are looking to address are ways that parents can have the opportunity to speak to more teachers within the parameters we can operate within.

We are aware that a number of parents were not able to see some staff yesterday. Some of the teaching staff at school, especially those in PE, Art, Music and Drama, do teach more than one teaching group in year 7 (around 60 students) and often close to, if not more than, 100 students. Given the number of appointments available there are, sadly, going to be parents that can't see all staff with the time available on the evening. We are starting to look at the calendar arrangements for next academic year and already have some ideas on ways that the evenings could be organised and run differently and we will update parents in due course.

It's always really impressive to hear about the successes of our current and former students outside of school. We recently had two representatives from year 12 in the North Somerset Concerto competition — an amazing achievement. The quality of music making that unfolded was astounding, and the adjudicating panel with the task of selecting winners from the four finalists, had one of their most difficult challenges yet. Katherine Dumbell opened the event with an almost flawless rendition of the Strauss Concerto for Horn & Orchestra in Eb Major. This was followed by Ellie Lloyd-Jones' beautiful and emotive performance of the Concerto in C minor for Cello and Orchestra by Vivaldi. Katherine, selected as one of the two overall winners, will perform her concerto with the North Somerset Sinfonia and Concert Band in the Gala Concerto Concert on the 30 March 2019 at 7.30pm in Gordano School's Theatre and tickets will be available at the door. 
