In recent years we have seen the emergence of new Multi Academy Trust (MAT) organisations around the country and around us. The MAT model is intended to combine resources, be more responsive to specific school needs and provide essential support services.

With all this in mind, and after considerable deliberation and meetings with a number of MATs, the Nailsea School Governing Body has agreed to formally consider becoming part of the Wessex Learning Trust. A final decision will only be made after a full consultation with our whole school communities, including you, the families of students at the schools, or of children considering joining us. The Wessex Learning Trust currently consists of eight schools, including first, middle and upper across the Cheddar Valley. We believe it is a great educational fit, with a similar ethos and drive for excellence.
