Course Outline:

At A level you are offered an inspiring experience that emphasises practical creativity alongside rigorous academic research and theoretical understanding. You will learn through experience, seeing theatre and making theatre for yourself.

You will be introduced to a wide range of theatrical styles and contexts as you explore plays practically and devise and work on performances. You can choose to develop as a performer, designer (lighting, sound, set, costume, puppets), director or a combination of these. Whichever option you choose, you will gain invaluable skills, both theatrical and transferable, to expand your horizons.

You will develop skills that are not just essential for drama but applicable to a wide range of higher education subjects and in the workplace. You will grow in confidence and maturity as you successfully realise your own ideas.
