It has been another busy week here at Nailsea with many students now having finished all of their public exams. As I mentioned last week, students have continued to impress with their behaviour. I

am sure parents are equally as relieved that this period is over and attention can turn to enjoying the summer—with the weather hopefully joining in at some point!

Taking assemblies this week, has given me the opportunity to share news of a future project with students. 2019/20 will be a really significant year for Nailsea School. As well as the current building being open 10 years, the school itself will be 60 years old—a milestone we could not ignore and plans are in place for making 2019/20 a real year of commemoration.

Nailsea Grammar School opened in September 1959 with 4 teaching staff and 90 pupils. The entire school build cost £177,000. In contrast, our current building cost £32 million. The cost of buildings are not the only changes that have happened in the intervening 60 years. During the assembly I shared some comments from the school log book including, amongst other things, records of student behaviour and punishments—different times indeed!. I will be spending next academic regularly sharing extracts from the Log book in this bulletin. It is a fascinating read.

The 60@Sixty logo (above) will also make regular appearances next year as we aim to raise £60,000. With school funding being cut nationally, I have had to make some difficult decisions about things that we can and cannot do/have as a school. Money raised during this fundraising drive will go directly back into the school. School council have been considering a 'wish list' of things that could be purchased with any funds raised. £60,000 may seem a large amount but breaking it down it would mean every member of the school community putting aside £1.50 during every school week of next year. For me, that means one less Costa coffee a week.

A letter will be coming home in the next week outlining the current plans in more detail and stating how as parents you can help. I am genuinely excited about the events we have planned and know they will help secure great opportunities and facilities at Nailsea School for both current and future pupils.

We are incredibly fortunate to be able to offer the 'Talk The Talk' experience to the whole of year 9 next week. Students will be attending their usual English classrooms at the start of the day on Monday and will be taking part in workshops for the day.



Talk The Talk's mission is to improve students' communication skills to enable positive interaction in all life situations. Research has suggested that developing these types of skills will be beneficial for students in all aspects of their lives. The charity has trained over 15,000 students in the past twelve months in England and Wales and nearly 75,000 since they first started - using a programme developed over the past six years.

The day highlights and nurtures employability skills, interview techniques and key presentation skills. Via numerous speaking opportunities, students are coached and supported throughout the day to deliver a structured two-minute presentation, on a topic for which they have a genuine passion, to their peers.
