

Nailsea School Wider Reopening Safety Measures

Some images to help you see what the school will look like and the measures we have taken for the wider opening of the school to years 10 and 12 from 15th June 2020



Students can **ONLY** enter from Mizzymead Road. All other entrances will be shut.

Yr 10 students will need to arrive no earlier than 9:20 am and will need to be seated for the start of their sessions at 9:40am.

Yr 12 students will need to arrive no earlier than 10 minutes prior to the start of their session.

Students should walk or cycle to school where possible and apply social distancing if walking with friends.

Students will **NOT** be permitted to be dropped off by car at the front of the school (unless a previous arrangement has existed with the Head of House).

Students should wear non uniform and should have washed their hands with soap for 20 seconds before leaving home.



On arrival students will need to adhere to the 2m social distancing guidelines. They can use the yellow tape as a guide.

Students should use hand sanitiser on entering the building.



All students will have their temperature checked on arrival (as does every member of staff and visitor).

This will be done through a forehead thermometer, as shown on the table.

If the check suggests that a pupil or member of staff is unwell they will be kept separate from other students/staff and be collected/leave school site.



Students will be based in the same areas of the school and the same room for their time on site.

Students on the X half (those in Mr Markey's and Mrs Coates' Maths groups) will attend on either Tuesday or Wednesday and will be based on the first floor classrooms. Students will access these rooms using ONLY the Media steps.

Students on the Y half (those in Miss Kelly's, Mrs Rogers', Mr Probert's or Mrs Groves' Maths groups) will attend on either Thursday or Friday and will be based on the ground floor classrooms. They will access these rooms using ONLY these doors in the atrium.



Hand Sanitiser stations are available around site.





Some areas of the school cannot be accessed. Please do not cross these barriers as they are there to ensure that the cleaning rota is adhered to. Students will not be able to access water fountains and so should bring a full bottle onto site.

Only certain toilets will be available for students to use based on where their classroom is based:

Ground floor toilets- opposite 37

First floor toilets – opposite 135





Students in years 10 will be subdivided into smaller groups – no more than 12 students will be in each group.

Staff will be present in the rooms to greet the students on arrival.

Year 10 students will need to remain in their allocated group and go straight to that room after being temperature checked.

Students are expected to maintain social distancing and should start sitting in the seats furthest from the door, first.

Every classroom will have the door propped open and windows will be open to aid ventilation. These cannot be closed so students may want to think about the clothing they wear to school. Students will be expected to use hand sanitiser prior to picking up the resources that will be at the front of the room. If required, tissues are in the room and should be disposed of in the lidded bin at the front of the room.





A yellow line will indicate where the member of staff will remain during the course of the lesson – adhering to the 2m distance rule.

Students will stay in the same room and, where there is more than one subject being delivered, staff will changeover at the allotted time.

Staff will be wiping down desks and equipment as they leave and when they arrive in a new room.





Students are expected to bring their own equipment to school; pen, pencil, ruler. They can bring their own exercise books with them but these will not be collected in to be marked by the teacher. Students will not be able to share or borrow equipment with other students.

It will be lovely to see students returning. As a reminder, it is vital that all students display outstanding behaviour when back in school. We cannot tolerate non engagement or disruption of learning at this time. Unacceptable behaviour will result in your son/daughter being sent home and, possibly, not returning to school for the remainder of the academic year.
