Dear Parents/carers

What a roller coaster Term 1 has been. It's been great to have students back and seeing them in the building made all the work involved in preparing the site over the summer worth it. As mentioned in an email from staff this week 'students have been fantastic' - although I am sure many are very ready for a break after an eight week term, as are many staff. As we head into the week away from school I wanted to highlight some key reminders/changes for all, as usual, set out under some key headings for reference.

School Day - Term 2

As families are aware, as part of our risk assessment the decision was taken to move to double lessons in the morning (periods 1 and 2 + periods 3 and 4) since September.

Having reviewed how this has been during this term, from the start of term 2 both breaktime and lunchtime will last for 30 mins each.

This will provide additional time for students to have a movement break between four hours of morning lessons and ensure that staff have slightly more time to move between bubbles and set up for their classes. This term has shown that, with the separate lunch outlets in each year bubble, there will not be an issue with students being unable to purchase/eat lunch in the 30 min break.

The school day will therefore run as follows: (with the difference on Wednesdays as previously explained to parents given the extended tutor time)

- 8:40 9:40 am Period 1
- 9:40 10:40 am Period 2
- 10:40 11:10am Break
- 11:10 12:10pm Period 3
- 12:10 1:10pm Period 4
- 1:10 1:40 pm Lunch
- 1:40 2:00pm Tutor Time
- 2:00 3:00pm Period 5

This is a temporary arrangement that will be reviewed again during term 2 for term 3 in January 2021.
