### Year 10 and 12 exams

Year 10 and 12 students have approached these exams in a very mature way. As I mentioned to my History group, the results of these exams are an indication of where students currently are and provide students and staff with an idea of things that can be worked on moving forwards. This week Gavin Williamson, the Education Secretary, told MPs on the Education Select Committee, that he wants students to sit GCSE and A Level exams next summer but stated there will likely be 'adjustments and mitigations' in place to ensure fairness. As soon as the details are known these will be shared with families.
