My assembly this week focused on the great leadership and resilience of Gareth Southgate and I will certainly be watching, possibly from behind a cushion, willing the team on for what would be the first victory at a major tournament in my lifetime!

Update following the government announcement

Earlier this week the Prime Minister shared with the nation his plans for the easing of Coronavirus guidelines and the Secretary of State for Education also shared with schools the steps they will take. This will involve the easing of restrictions to self-isolate, the use of face coverings and on site testing at the beginning of the new academic year.

From a school perspective, all the measures we are currently taking, which includes the use of face coverings for staff in school and the isolation of students when a positive test occurs, will continue until the end of term. It was made clear in the guidance this should be the case. With 8 school days left of the academic year I would urge everyone to continue to follow current guidance, including regularly testing at home. These measures will continue to make a difference in ensuring that we can safely operate until the summer break.

It is highly likely that at the start of the new academic year students will require two on-site tests. This expectation could impact on the start of term arrangements that have previously been shared. I will write to parents to pass on any changes and the plans when the logistics have been finalised. As ever, thank you for your patience and support as we continue to manage this in school.

I know that many families would have breathed a sigh of relief with the Prime Minister's announcement regarding the easing of restrictions. It has been made clear to schools that the vast majority of restrictions will no longer apply in the new academic year. I am hopeful this will ensure students have more consistent time in school and do not need to be isolated, as has been the case this year.

It does remain important that we are disciplined in the run up to the end of the academic year though. As such I would ask that we continue to abide by local and national guidelines. To quote Walt Disney 'All the adversity I've had in my life, all my troubles and obstacles, have strengthened me'.

Acrylic/False nails

There has been a noticeable increase in the last week of students coming into school with false/acrylic nails. As mentioned several times in my letters home, this is clearly against our uniform policy. Our uniform guidance on the website states:

NAILS

Nails should be of an appropriate length to comply with Health & Safety guidelines and be natural and with a clear neutral colour

I understand the process of applying acrylic nails and varnish are costly and I urge families to refrain from this until the summer break. Students will be asked to remove these nails and students not meeting this expectation will not be allowed to attend lessons until the issue has been fully resolved. Again, I should stress that this is absolutely the last thing we want as a school as we all place great emphasis on good attendance to school and to lessons. However, I am also a firm believer in high standards and the consistent application of these in order to prepare students for the world of work and life beyond school. Thank you, in advance, for working with us at school in providing a consistent message for our students, your children.

- ♣ PE Polo Shirt (Navy & Gold)
- Plain Navy sports shorts (not cycling shorts)
- Reversible Navy & Gold Rugby Shirt
- Trainers
- ♣ White sports socks, long Navy socks-needed when wearing shin pads
- A pair of shin pads (for football and hockey)
- A gum shield (compulsory for Hockey and competitive rugby)
- Football boots when playing competitive Football/Rugby
- No jewellery

Optional Items

- A pair of Navy Blue sports leggings with printed Nailsea logo
- A plain Navy Blue jumper (Optional) (no hoodies)
- Plain Navy tracksuit bottoms (Winter only, optional)
- Hoodless waterproof Navy coat (optional)
- Skorts (optional for games activities only)
