Dear Parents/carers

I hope everyone has had a good week. Students and staff are continuing to settle well into term with a full cycle of the two week timetable having been completed.

Open Evening – Thurs 30th September

Although organised slightly differently this year it will be lovely to be able to welcome families on site for our Open Evening next week. A number of students have already volunteered to be guides and will be rightly rewarded with house points for their efforts. So that we can keep everyone as safe as possible this year we have staggered times for our Open Evening visits from prospective parents. The three original presentations and tour slots on the evening were, quite overwhelmingly, fully booked within two days. As such we have taken the decision to include a further presentation at 4pm.

In order for staff to have time to prepare for this **school will finish for students at 2pm on Thursday 30th September.** So that students and staff can have some time to compensate for a later finish, as we usually do, school will **start for students at 9:40am on Friday 1st October.** I appreciate the earlier finish on a Thursday is a change to usual practice but I hope parents can understand the importance of this day in the school calendar.

For students travelling by school transport amendments are being made. If any student does need to stay at school until 3pm on Thursday or arrive at school at the normal time of 8:40am on Friday they should report to 161, bringing a book with them, where they will be supervised.

Vaccination update

As mentioned last week, the school has been advised that all students in Years 8-11 will be offered a vaccination by mid-November. In order to reduce disruption to both the students and the school the nursing team will be conducting both the nasal flu and COVID-19 vaccinations at the same sessions.

Parents will be receiving consent forms for <u>each vaccine individually</u> and will be able to express their wishes for either, or both, vaccines. <u>The teams will only be vaccinating young people with parental consent.</u>

School Nursing Team

Sirona Care and Health School Nursing Service has worked closely with us to set up the delivery of a new clinic which will offer young people an opportunity to access a free, confidential, non-judgmental health service. Within these clinics, the team will be able to provide support, guidance and professional advice on a wide range of health issues/concerns. This will start on Tuesdays, initially through appointment and then be open to drop ins. The team will be based in an office off of reception.

Whilst this service will be confidential, all young people who visit the clinic are encouraged to involve their parents/carers in all aspects of their healthcare. As with all our services, safeguarding policies and protocols will be followed and appropriate action taken should any safeguarding concerns arise regarding a young person.
