Dear Parents/Carers

I am writing this week's letter with slightly sore feet but with a huge feeling of pride reflecting back on last night's Open Evening. As you know this was done slightly differently this year in order to mitigate any risks to the school and wider community but the event still very much had the same 'feel', showing just how warm and welcoming our school is. Having to include 4 presentations, responding to demand, meant staff and students were touring and talking for four hours – a huge effort. The positive responses received from parents and students as they left certainly made it all worthwhile. We have already received a number of emails from prospective parents thanking the staff and students for their time and effort. Lots of the praise was for the exceptional job the student tour guides did so, as well as receiving the house points on offer, these students should reflect on the hugely positive impact they have had on our community and be rightly proud of themselves.

Reporting illness and use of First Aid room

As has been the current practice for a while, parents should continue to use the c19@nailseaschool.com email address to report any issues related to Covid-19. It would be very helpful if this initial email included the name and tutor group of the child and the date when symptoms started, if any. Once confirmed information related to the end of isolation is also very helpful. This will ensure that our records are updated internally and classroom teachers can be informed.

We are also aware, as has also been reported nationally, that there is currently quite a nasty cold working its way through the community. Students should be referred to the First Aid room in the event of an emergency (a fall/bleeding/vomiting/feeling faint). This week, on average, there have been 15 referrals to First Aid every day with the vast majority of these being non emergencies. We would greatly appreciate you discussing the importance of students using self-management skills, for example in keeping themselves hydrated, so that these large numbers can be reduced and managed within the school.

Vaccination update

We have had it confirmed that vaccinations for students at Nailsea will be scheduled for term 2.
