No Pens Day

Speaking to students I have had some great feedback regarding the specific inclusion of speech and language activities during 'No Pens Day' that was held nationally on Wednesday this week. Research shows that speaking and understanding skills are fundamental for everything we do – learning, reading and writing, managing emotions, developing friendships and entering employment. However, speaking and understanding skills are underrepresented in the curriculum in comparison to reading and writing. This is something we are really focusing on changing both at Nailsea and across the Wessex Learning Trust.

Many thanks to the 200 students who also completed a survey about their experiences, through ClassCharts, and I will be sharing the findings with staff this week.

The Trust INSET day on Tuesday January 4th has Speech Language and Communication as the key focus so I will be able to update you on our ongoing plans in term 3.

Vaccinations

Many thanks to the team from Sirona and the many Nailsea staff involved in the successful administering of both Covid and Flu vaccinations this week. It was a huge logistical task but given the organisation and cooperation of all, the team finished a day earlier than expected. If any parents completed the paper form and/or missed the deadline for sending the forms into Sirona and/or their child was absent from school on the two days they were held, the nursing team will be holding catch up sessions in the future. As soon as we know the details of these we will let you all know.

Covid Reminders

- Parents continue to use the c19@nailseaschool email address to **report any issues related to Covid-19**. It would be very helpful if this initial email included the name

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and tutor group of the child and the date when symptoms started, if any. Once confirmed information related to the end of isolation is also very helpful. This will ensure that our records are updated internally and classroom teachers can be informed.

- Students to **continue twice weekly home testing** to pick up asymptomatic cases
- **Students should not come to school if suffering from symptoms of COVID-19** (high temperature, loss of taste or smell, continuous cough). If your child does show symptoms please take them for a PCR test as per NHS guidelines.
- **Masks** to be worn on home-to-school transport and those who travel to school by public transport, in corridors and communal indoor areas at breaktime and lunchtime when not eating. They can be worn in classes if students wish.
- **Internal social areas divided up per year group at break time and lunchtime** will continue during the period of amber escalation.
- **Use of hand gel, ventilation and enhanced cleaning measures.**

Mock exams begin for students next week for students in years 11 and 13, with some students also continuing to prepare for external exams in January. As a reminder

- Students should arrive 15 mins before the exam at the exam venue
- Students should be aware of their seat before arrival
- Students sitting an exam in Science, Maths and Languages should be clear of their tier of entry before arrival
- Students should bring correct equipment in a see through pencil case
- Students should deposit bags in lockers before arriving at the exam venue
- Students cannot bring any mobile device into the exam venue
- Water bottles can be brought into the venue, but should be clear. Any disruption to the exam caused by students using these will be logged.

We understand that for many students this will be the first time in a large exam venue. This experience is part of their preparation for the final exams in the summer and I know that with focus this experience will be a productive one. I wish all the students the best for this period. #AimHigh
