Start of term arrangements - Monday 5th and Tuesday 6th September

Year 7 and 12 students only are expected in school on Monday 5th September.

<u>All students</u> will be on site for the start of the academic year at 8:40am on Tuesday 6th September. The day will start with tutor time so that timetables can be distributed. Lessons will start at 9:35 am and follow week one.
