Synoptix is a Systems Engineering Consultancy, supporting engineering programmes across aerospace, defence, rail, marine and power sectors. Their core engineering team applies systems engineering principles to complex projects, supported by a selection of high-calibre, scarce-skills Subject Matter Experts (SMEs).

With a history dating back to 1939, Rosslyn Park 7s has since evolved into the largest school rugby tournament with over 10,000 boys and girls aged 11-18 competing annually.

The Nailsea School squad were selected as one of 275 teams in U16 Colts category for 2023.



With over 1,000 state and private schools applying for the tournament in 2022/23, it is a fantastic achievement for the squad and the school.

Mrs Elliott, Headteacher said:

"I am so thrilled that our Under 16 Colts are on their way to Rosslyn Park. The team have worked hard both on and off the pitch to make this happen. Well done to them and to their coaches - they should be very proud of the success they have earned."

The tournament draws inspiration from current and past

professional players, coaches and support staff participating students will be able to immerse themselves in an elite environment playing against and watching the next Academy and International rugby stars of the future.

Fourteen students from years 10 and 11 were selected for the team. The students were thankful to have received sponsorship from Pure Comms, JSR, and the Nailsea School PTA as well as working on fundraising themselves to help cover the costs of a new kit, away-day hoodie and travel.

Reducing our Carbon Footprint

In December it was announced that schools would receive additional funding to help with energy efficiency. Nailsea School received £42,000; money which has been spent around the school to decrease our use of energy and thereby reduce our carbon footprint.

For some years now we have been replacing our lighting to more efficient LED panels and this funding has enabled us to move one step closer to its completion. The funding has allowed us to roll-out the programme to the Sports Hall, the Auditorium and it has also enabled us to make some upgrades to our Plant Room, including new technology which monitors our hot water and our heating system.

Over the Easter break we will extend the project to the Green Lecture Theatre, the corridors by the technology department and the large student break out area of room 161. High use areas such as the Sports Hall will see the school making a saving of up to 76% of our energy usage.

We continue to strive to make our school as carbon efficient as possible.

Duke of Edinburgh Awards

This term ten year 11 students embarked on their Duke of Edinburgh expedition. These two days were the culmination of 2 years hard work planning and preparing. The groups set off from Yatton with the goal of arriving at Cheddar Reservoir for the end of their second day, with many of the students in the group having had no navigating or walking experience before embarking on the award.

With the exception of some light drizzle and a strong breeze, the weather gods remained relatively on side over the two days and this helped keep morale levels high. Both groups exceeded their distance aims and were given additional navigational challenges on each of the days. Students have shared personal highlights regarding pushing themselves, encountering nature first hand and witnessing a range of different scenery.

Staff involved with supporting the groups were hugely impressed with the determination, teamwork and encouragement demonstrated across the two days. Well done all!
