Despite some cloud cover and intermittent heavy showers on the final day, students were again blessed by the weather gods with warm and pleasant conditions on an unpredictable Dartmoor for their expedition. A bumper year for students completing the Silver award saw 7 groups and almost 50 pupils set off from South Brent bright and early Thursday morning. After some tricky navigating across open moorland on day one, all groups settled in to a peaceful hilltop campsite for their first night and were treated to a beautiful sunrise on their second day.

Year 7 Fieldwork

Year 7s have been studying how places change over time, with a special focus on Nailsea and Bristol. As part of the topic students have been carrying out fieldwork in the high street, investigating whether Nailsea is a clone town (a town that is indistinguishable from other towns) or a home town (a town is unique and has distinctive features). The students have been excellent, and it has been fascinating to see where Nailsea falls on this continuum.



Year 8 Fieldwork on Environments

Year 8s have been out and about around the Nailsea site collecting valuable fieldwork data on the different environments we have on site. Students have been doing an environmental quality survey which allows them to evaluate the quality of the environment and compare different areas. They have also been mastering their fieldwork sketches. Excellent work year 8s!

Year 9 Glaciation Creativity



Year 9 have been learning about glacial processes and landforms. This gives students superb core knowledge for starting their GCSE, especially for the climate change and distinctive landscape topics. Students have been showing off their creativity by creating glacial landscapes out of playdough. Their challenge was to create landscapes of glacial erosion and deposition.

On the 20th and 22nd of June 120 of our year 10 GCSE Geography students visited Sandbay to collect important coastal fieldwork for their distinctive landscapes topic and the fieldwork exam question.

The sun was shining both days and students collected excellent data on the various geomorphic processes shaping the coastline and examined how effective coastal management was.
