Home-School Agreement

The aim of the Sixth Form Home-School Agreement is to ensure that students achieve their best in their chosen courses and act as a positive role model at Nailsea School.

STUDENT

A) As a member of a subject group I will:

- 1. Take an active and positive role in my learning
- 2. Work hard to achieve at least my Target Grades
- 3. Attend and be punctual for all my lessons
- 4. Hand in assignments/coursework/homework by set deadlines and to the highest possible standard
- 5. Use the ICT network only to support my learning
- 6. Ask staff for help when necessary, in order to gain the maximum benefit from the support available

B) As a member of a tutor group I will:

- 1. Attend and be punctual for registration and other appointments with my Tutor
- 2. Make best use of Supervised Study periods
- 3. Attend assembly for my year group
- 4. Ensure that my parent(s)/carers(s) follow the school's absence reporting system if I am absent from school
- 5. Inform my Tutor of any issues affecting my learning
- 6. Take an active part in the life of the Sixth Form and Tutor Group activities

C) As a member of Nailsea School Sixth Form I will:

- 1. Behave in a courteous and polite manner towards every person in the school
- 2. Treat all areas of the school with respect and take responsibility for my actions
- 3. Follow the Sixth Form dress code at all times including during exam periods
- 4. Wear my lanyard at all times in school
- 5. Aim for 96% attendance record to all Sixth Form sessions
- 6. Ensure that I do not exceed 10 hours paid part time work per week

D) I understand that failure to adhere to these expectations may result in some or all the following:

- 1. My parent(s)/carer(s) will be contacted
- 2. I may be sent home by the Assistant Headteacher in charge of Sixth Form
- 3. I may be removed from lessons and placed under the supervision of the Assistant Headteacher for the duration of the day
- 4. I may be placed on report
- 5. I may be given further sanctions as enforced by the Assistant Headteacher in charge of Sixth Form
- 6. I may be placed on the Sixth Form Conduct Policy, which may finally result in termination of study

PARENT/CARER

A) To fully support the Sixth Former Parents/Carers are expected to:

- 1. Follow the school's absence reporting system to notify any absence
- 2. Limit the student's number of hours paid outside work to 10 per week
- 3. Attend parent/carer meetings
- 4. Ensure that attendance is between 90% and 100%
- 5. Ensure that the student attends registration and assemblies
- 6. Ensure that the student leaves home dressed in line with the dress code and with their lanyard

SCHOOL

A) Your subject teachers will:

- 1. Provide you with information about courses
- 2. Give you feedback on your progress
- 3. Inform your Tutor/HOY/Head of Sixth Form of any concerns
- 4. Contact your parents/carers as required
- 5. Monitor your attendance to their subject
- 6. Welcome your views about their subject

B) Your Tutor will:

- 1. Monitor your overall progress
- 2. Take the register daily and monitor your attendance to all lessons
- 3. Provide advice and guidance on a range of issues
- 4. Guide you with UCAS applications and other progression routes
- 5. Contact your Parents/Carers as required
- 6. Pass on messages from staff

C) You can expect from the Sixth Form:

- 1. Staff to be polite and to treat you courteously
- 2. A well-equipped study area to assist you with your studies
- 3. A stimulating working environment and good social facilities
- 4. Advice, guidance and support on a range of issues
- 5. Parents/Carers to be contacted if there are any concerns regarding your conduct
- 6. A Sixth Form Council to represent your views and opinions
