Code of Conduct



We have high expectations of our students at Nailsea Sixth Form, and place great emphasise on them acting as role models for our younger students and making positive contributions to our learning community. We promote three rules which set out our expectations:

- o By arriving at school and to every lesson on time
- By meeting all set deadlines
- By bringing all of the necessary equipment to school

○ BE RESPECTFUL ○

- To your peers by showing kindness and empathy
- o To staff by listening to instructions and engaging in lesson activities
- o To our environment by taking care of the Sixth Form and lower school site

• BE RESPONSIBLE •

- o When in lessons by taking ownership of your learning
- o When travelling around the school site by acting as a role model for younger students
- o When in the local community by representing our school with pride

If a student consistently fails to meet our expectations without good reason, they will move on to our conduct system, which ultimately could result in being asked to leave the Sixth Form.

Attendance



At Nailsea School we expect 100% attendance when students are in good health. This applies to all scheduled sessions; lessons, assemblies, tutor time and supervised study. Students are expected to be punctual and arrive on-time to all lessons.

Research has shown that Sixth Form students with an attendance of 95% achieve on average one grade higher than students with an attendance of 85%. Therefore, a high level of attendance is crucial if students are to achieve.

If attendance over the academic year is below 90% in Year 12, students may not be able to progress to Year 13. Similarly, if attendance falls below 90% in Year 13, students may not be entered for their examinations.

Students will:

- Take responsibility for their performance by maintaining high levels of attendance and punctuality
- Follow Sixth Form procedures for attendance and punctuality
- Attend all scheduled lessons, tutor periods, assemblies, enrichment and supervised study lessons
- Contact their teachers to catch up on any missed work
- Seek to maintain an attendance level of 100%

Parents/Carers will:

- Fully support the Sixth Form attendance policy
- Notify the school of any absences or any matters that may affect attendance
- Support their child so that they meet our attendance expectations

Absences

Students will not fulfil their potential if they have poor attendance. Unless absolutely necessary, students should always seek to attend their lessons. Where they need special consideration, communication must be made with the Sixth Form Leadership Team in advance to gain permission for any alternative arrangements.

Authorised absences

The Head of Year must be informed by parents, in writing, in advance of any planned absences. Please note that authorisation is rarely given, however consideration (at the discretion of the Headteacher) will be given for family bereavement, medical appointments, university open days and interviews.

Unauthorised absences

Home Study

Students will have a set number of Home Study periods on their timetables to work from home. However, this privilege will be withdrawn if a student is not keeping up with set work or deadlines.

Class Charts



Students

Class Charts is our school system where teachers complete registers, reward positive learning behaviours and raise any concerns around meeting our expectations. This is also the platform where students will be able to view their timetable and monitor any homework that is set from teaching staff or tutors. It is essential that students regularly use this platform to support their studies.

Students will be given a personalised code to set up their Class Charts pupil account as part of the induction process.

Dress Code



There is no formal uniform requirement, however, as a member of our Sixth Form within a wider school community we do have a dress code.

The objectives of the dress code are to:

- Ensure that all members of the Sixth Form dress appropriately for an educational setting
- Set an example for the younger students within our school community
- Provide the wider community with a positive image of Nailsea School and Sixth Form

We encourage individuality and the freedom to express yourself but do not expect:

- Any extremes of hair colour
- Extreme facial body piercings
- Body art on display
- Clothing that may cause offense to others
- Clothing considered by staff to be a health and safety risk
- Excessive skin to be on show
 - (short skirts/shorts, low cut tops or midriffs on show)
- Beach wear
- Hats or hoods to be worn indoors
- Coats to be worn in lessons

Lanyards and name badges must be worn and visible at all times as part of our whole-school safeguarding policy. These identify Sixth Form students as a trusted adult on-site.

Phones and headphones are allowed in school, but should only be visible when students are within the Sixth Form areas. It is important that students model our expectations of lower school students whilst walking around the school site.

Tutors and other school staff will guide students on whether their attire meets the standards required. The Sixth Form Team will make any final decisions regarding dress code.

Folder Policy and Equipment



Folder Policy

Students are expected to have a Lever Arch folder for every subject they study. Their folders should be organised and provide clear evidence of the work they are doing and the progress they are making. Folder checks will be carried out by teachers and tutors to ensure high standards are maintained.

Student folders must include:

- Progress Tracker with Target Grade
- Aim Higher Booklet (Y12)
- Dividers linked to units which must include:
 - Personal Learning Checklist (PLC)
 - Class notes
 - Assessments

Equipment

All students will need, and are expected to have the following:

- Pens, Pencils
- Ruler
- Highlighters
- Different colour pens for annotating notes or making diagrams
- Subject specific equipment e.g. calculator

We recommend students have a hole punch and stapler, as well as A4 poly-pockets.

Pastoral Programme

Sixth Form Pastoral Curriculum

At Nailsea Sixth Form, we have a robust pastoral curriculum that is designed to prepare all learners to succeed in their studies and their life beyond school.

We have a variety of programmes that run within tutor time to be able to achieve our aims of:

- Providing 'Super Curricular' opportunities
- Coaching students academic and personal development
- Building the A-Level mindset through the VESPA programme
- Supporting learners' physical and mental wellbeing
- Preparing learners for independence in society through the ABSolute curriculum and deliver compulsory PSHE content
- Exposing students to a wide range of public speakers
- Ensuring students have considered all possibilities for their pathways beyond Nailsea Sixth Form

Pastoral support

At the heart of Nailsea School and Sixth Form, we believe that learners come first. There is a clear priority on learners wellbeing, and therefore there is a wide offer of pastoral support available in the Sixth Form.

All students will have a personal Tutor, a Head of Year, Head of Sixth Form and a dedicated Sixth Form Learning Mentor to provide support. In addition, we have a dedicated Safeguarding Team who can signpost further support inside and outside of school.

We encourage all students who are experiencing barriers affecting their learning, are feeling anxious, or needing support to speak to the Sixth Form Team.

Career advice and guidance



Pathways Programme

As a Sixth Form we offer learners support and guidance on careers, employability and UCAS through a range of group tutorials, 1:1s and presentations, to support students through the processes of deciding what their next steps will be.

One dedicated tutor time each week will support learners with understanding the routes available to them post-18. It will give them opportunity to explore their different routes, and as part of this there will be trips and external speakers to ensure all students make an informed decision about their next steps.

The pathways programme will coach students through the application process, from university applications, apprenticeships and jobs, to ensure that learners are prepared to submit high quality applications where they stand out. Interview skills become a focus in Year 13.

Learners will be encouraged to participate in work experience, with a dedicated work experience week scheduled for Term 6.

Ensuring Nailsea Sixth Form students have a competitive personal profile and CV is a key focus of the programme, and students are supported to participate in opportunities throughout the two years.

Unifrog

Every Sixth Form student has access to Unifrog, an online careers platform that supports students decide their next steps onto university courses, apprenticeships, employment and gap years. As part of our careers programme, students will build a portfolio of careers related activities and skills which are used to create high quality personal statements and applications.

Parents can log in at www.unifrog.org using the code 'NSEAparents' to set up their account.

Careers Advisor

All Sixth Form students have access to a dedicated Careers Advisor, in addition to the support of their tutor and the Sixth Form Team.

1:1 Careers Advisor meetings will take place at timetabled periods across the two academic years, and additional meetings can be arranged as required.

Student Leadership



At Nailsea Sixth Form, we view every Sixth Former as a leader and we will develop their leadership skills through three overlapping concepts:

Everyday Leadership

We will support students in becoming fully autonomous and driving their own academic development. This life skill will be invaluable for students taking the next steps in their careers.

Every student will demonstrate leadership in different ways which will be acknowledged and celebrated. We recognise the powerful impact that daily actions can have on our own and each other's lives. We promote 'everyday leadership' and recognise how empathy, generosity of spirit and acts of kindness and challenging unfairness can transform lives.

Student leadership is at the heart of Nailsea Sixth Form, and we encourage all students to engage in our wide range of leadership opportunities, as leadership is for everyone.

Formal Leadership Roles

The Prefect Team is integral to our Sixth Form. They have more responsibility and authority within the school and work directly with the Head of Sixth Form and Headteacher.

There are three levels to our Prefect system at Nailsea Sixth Form:

1. Head Prefects

Those students selected as our Head Prefects lead our whole-school council and Sixth Form student leadership team, alongside representing the school at key events throughout the year and running assemblies within the lower school.

2. Senior Prefects

The group of students selected as Senior Prefects lead projects for the Sixth Form and wider school community as part of their role. They also represent the school at key events and support the Head Prefects in leading assemblies.

3. Prefects


The group of students selected as Prefects support the Senior Prefects in contributing to the various projects and events being organised.

Enrichment

The purpose of our 360° Enrichment Programme is for students to study concepts in greater depth and complexity, or sparking the curiosity to pursue areas of interest that will support their holistic development and benefit their future life choices.

360° Enrichment is timetabled on a Tuesday afternoon, however there are many opportunities that fall outside of this time allocation into our wider whole-school extra-curricular programme or through personalised placements that have been organised by individual students.

Every student is expected to fully engage in our 360° Enrichment Programme, and we are confident that we have created a broad and balanced offer which will be of value to each individual.
