Parent Carer Survey

Many thanks to the parents that contributed to the Parent Carer survey that was seeking views about our ABSolute curriculum. Having analysed the results I can pass on that

- 1. **86%** of respondents feel that the content covered in these sessions is important.
- 2. **83**% felt that the current curriculum prepares their child with the relevant skills and knowledge for growing up.
- 3. **74%** of respondents gave four or five stars for the quality of teaching and resources being provided through the ABSolute Curriculum.

There were some comments made from a minority of respondents that suggested the quality of the delivery could be improved and that some student behaviour was going unchallenged in these sessions. These two areas have now been prioritised as a key focus of our quality assurance processes in term 4. As a school we are always keen to seek feedback and, as shown, will always take action related to any suggestions made. Thank you again for your ongoing support and suggestions.

Donations for Ghana


