Use of Station Road and Bucklands Batch by pedestrians and cyclists

North Somerset council have asked us to remind students and parents that the Station Rd/Bucklands Batch cycle path is intended for uphill cycling only. This is because cyclists move more slowly when climbing a hill and the path is a safety feature that allows for this change in speed. Pedestrians should be vigilant and be mindful of others using the area, keeping with the allocated spaces. Blue and white signs show where pedestrians/cyclists should be on the route.

When cycling downhill in the direction of Nailsea and Backwell station, cyclists must be on the road.

Vaping on the bus

We have received complaints from First Bus and from some parents about a number of older students vaping on the Long Ashton public bus. Vaping is prohibited on public transport and First Bus are within their rights to deny access to students who are identified by the on board cameras. If your child catches this bus please can you talk to them about their behaviour, remind them they are easily identifiable in school uniform and should be mindful of the health and safety of other passengers. The extent of the problem is that First Bus may now decide to start removing students from the bus as a result of their behaviour.
