








## **Assessment and Reporting info**

Our assessment scale runs from 1 to 9. A student's target is calculated against the SATs scaled scores.

Each subject uses a 'progress ladder' to assess what students have mastered and what they need to do to improve. The criteria is written for each year group, focusing on relevant content and skills.

We assess typically at the end of term. Students receive individual feedback from their teacher after an assessment, with guidance on what they need to do next. This is 'green pen' work.

#### **Key Dates**

In early October we will send home a 'settling-in report'.

This is followed up with a tutor evening on **16 October**, this is in-person.

In **January** students get a second report showing academic and pastoral progress.

There is an online subject evening on **Thursday 5 March**.

The last report home is in **term 6**.

#### **ABSolute Curriculum**




Our ABSolute curriculum offers an array of exciting curriculum enrichment activities including talks, trips, workshops and visits to help all students; aspire, believe and succeed.



### **Attendance and Punctuality**

- All students are expected to have 96% attendance.
- Under 90% = persistent absence. This could lead to fines being imposed.
- Attendance has a direct impact on achievement.
- School starts at 8:30 am.
- Lateness = lost learning over the year:

5 mins late each day = 3 days lost
```

10 mins late each day = 6.5 days lost

15 mins late each day = 10 days lost

20 mins late each day = 13 days lost

30 mins late each day = 19 days lost
