Move to Biometric System

As mentioned for the first time last week, please find another version of the letter and frequently asked questions previously shared, outlining the plan for the school to move to a biometric system for students to pay for food/meals from September 2025. This is being undertaken to speed up the dining experience, allowing students to pay for their meals using their fingers and also increase the security of money on student accounts. Given that we are planning to process the biometric data for students currently in years 7, 8, 9 and 10 this term, we need parental consent. The deadline for this is <u>Monday 7th July at 3pm</u>. Moving forward any student that we do not hold parental consent for will not be able to purchase food on site and so will need to come to school with their own snacks/packed lunch. We intend to start collating data from students on Tuesday 8th July, with the new system being in operation from Wednesday 9th July. <u>As a reminder, students that do not have permission granted will not be able to purchase food from any catering servery moving forward.</u>

Move to 'My Child At School' (MCAS)

You may remember that earlier in the year we informed you that we are moving to a new management information system called Bromcom, which we started using on the 1st of April 2025. The system is our main database of information for both students and staff and with the introduction of Bromcom, we are now able to incorporate other aspects of school life, which historically have had to be managed by third party systems. This will enable us to streamline our communications to you, as well as reduce costs, and as a parent you will only now need one app, which is called My Child at School (MCAS). Please find an additional letter, attached, that outlines next steps for parents and carers.

Finally... it has been a pleasure to see the students and parents who are moving into the next stage of their education with us, this week. On Thursday we saw current year 11 students from Nailsea and those from other local schools attend their 6th form transition day. It was great to see so many returning and I trust the students began to familiarise themselves with their new 6th form surroundings, ahead of joining us officially as year 12 students in September. Thursday afternoon also saw great sunshine as we welcomed current year 6 students and their families for our 'Big House Party'. This is an informal event that enables those starting with us in year 7 to get to know some key staff ahead of their official induction day next week. Despite there only being 10 school days left of the year, there are certainly no signs of term slowing down as yet!
