



Nailsea School: Pupil Premium Support.

The information below details some of the financial support that can be offered to students in school. There will always be cases where a student's individual needs and personal situation are taken into consideration; this type of support might not be detailed here.

Area of support	Support from the school	How do families access the support?
Lunches	<p>Not all Pupil Premium students are entitled to a free main meal each day. Please check your eligibility via the North Somerset website.</p> <p><i>If your child is eligible at primary school, you must inform North Somerset of their change of school. North Somerset will then inform us.</i></p> <p>Those students who are eligible will have their 'card' loaded with money before lunch each day. The funding will not be available at breaktime. If the money is not used, it will be removed at the end of the day.</p>	<p>Free school meals are applied for via: http://www.n-somerset.gov.uk/my-services/schools-learning/local-schools/schoolmeals/freeschoolmeals/</p> <p><i>If your child is eligible at primary school, you must inform North Somerset of their change of school. North Somerset will then inform us.</i></p>
School Uniform	<p>As the purchasing of our branded uniform has moved online, the school is no longer giving vouchers for uniform. We will however still be able to support families in the purchase.</p>	<p>Please contact either your child's Head of House or srutty@nailseaschool.com if there are specific needs.</p>
Music lessons	<p>Students are offered support towards peripatetic music lessons (on a variety of instruments) and singing lessons. The funding covers up to a maximum of 30% of the annual costs, which does significantly reduce them.</p>	<p>Music lessons are organised by the Music Department. Information can be accessed by speaking to the Head of Music. Letters will be sent by the department to the parents.</p>





		If your child is taking GCSE Music, the subsidy will be increased. Please contact Sophie Ratty directly to discuss.
Residential Trips and visits	Financial support is available towards the overall cost of residential trips. This is usually a percentage of the trips' cost.	Parents should contact the trip organiser to discuss this support.
Priority Career guidance	In Y10, we prioritise impartial career guidance for students to help them have a clear goal for when they leave us (either at the end of Y11 or Y13).	Appointments for Y10s begin in Term 5 each academic year. The appointments are held in school and a detailed action plan produced and shared with the student via Unifrog.
Additional pastoral support	<p>We have a team of mentors who will be supporting students to ensure they make the best possible progress.</p> <p>If appropriate, interventions will be put in place to focus on supporting your child. This may mean:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Small group work outside of the classroom • In class interventions or targeted meetings • 1:1 work outside of the classroom. <p>These short-term programmes are aimed at supporting individual needs.</p>	<p>These interventions are organised by Sophie Ratty & Dominic Graffagnino (Assistant Heads) in liaison with class teachers and tutors.</p> <p>srutty@nailseaschool.com</p>
Other financial support	<p>Support can also be given towards:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subject specific trips • Books and equipment • Clubs • Other reasonable requests from families 	<p>Typically, this support is organised by curriculum areas. For trips, funding may be based on a consent form being completed by a parent or carer.</p> <p>If a student would like to attend a club run by the school, students or families can approach the member of staff running the activity.</p> <p>In the event of a family wishing to make an additional request for Pupil Premium funding all enquiries should be made to</p>

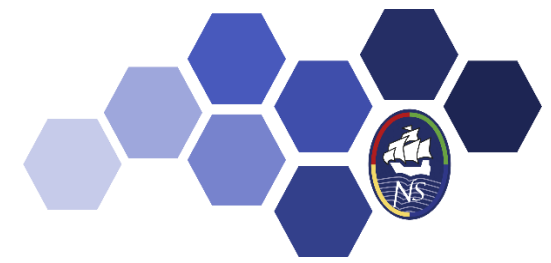

Non-financial support	<p>A range of support is given to students who are eligible for Pupil Premium support. Teachers, tutors and other school staff are aware where a student is in receipt of Pupil Premium and will personalise provision in their lessons as required without stigmatizing or drawing attention to the fact. In addition, and where required, students can access support such as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Homework support – timings for 'Study Space' will be confirmed at the start of each academic year. These sessions usually run three times per week and students are supported by our team of mentors. • Small group programmes to support a range of needs including social thinking, confidence, resilience & organisational skills.
