Teachers, tutors and other school staff are aware where a student is in receipt of Pupil Premium and will personalise provision in their lessons as required without stigmatizing or drawing attention to the fact. In addition, and where required, students can access support such as:	
	 Homework support – timings for 'Study Space' will be confirmed at the start of each academic year. These sessions usually run three times per week and students are supported by our team of mentors. Small group programmes to support a range of needs including social thinking, confidence, resilience & organisational skills.
