- Make a glossary of key terms using your learning journey.
- Mind map out the answers to your key questions on your learning journey.
- Draw out key diagrams for example of how landforms are formed.
- Create flash cards of your case studies and examples.
- Reduce topics into the most important points
- After you have produced your glossary of key words test yourself (or a friend).
- Look, cover and draw your diagrams until you remember them.
- Explain a topic in your own words.
- Use your flash cards to get someone to test you on your case study knowledge.
- Color code impacts- social, economic and environmental.
- Complete a Seneca assignment on your topic to test your self.
- Teach someone else the topic.
- Complete an exam style question.
- Complete a quiz on BBC bitesize.
- Rag rate what you need to revise further from your quizzes/exam questions.
