Work Experience Monday 22 – Friday 26 June 2026

- It makes your learning real
- Helps you think about your ambitions in a more realistic and informed way
- Gives you the chance to find out what work is really like
- A chance to find out about particular jobs
- It provides you with skills and experience to write about in applications for college, University & jobs.
- It will provide staff at school with information about your work skills to help them write you a reference.

Finding placements

- Keep an eye out for Bromcom communications.
- Think about experiences that are relevant to the school subject that is most related to the job or industry you'd like to go into.
- Remember that it is about developing **skills** there are certain professions that simply don't offer WEX to under 16s.

Finding out what is available

You will be responsible for arranging your own placement with an employer

- Ask parents/guardians or relatives/friends/family
- Ask local employers- <u>it is best to go in person</u> but you could telephone or email them.
- Research online
- Create a shortlist don't bank on being successful with your first enquiry.

What should I say to employers?

Explain that you are looking for a work experience placement.

Tell them the dates

Be prepared to explain why you want the placement. Always say thank you.




Other things to consider.

- Competition with other schools
- Travel (where are you prepared to travel to?)
- Popularity of placements vets, primary schools
- Some employers (NHS) may require nomination through the school – see Mrs Rutty or Mrs Humphreys (room 101)
- Some large employers not offering WEX, eg Police

Other things to consider.


- If you are offered a placement outside of the school's week, don't panic.
- Complete your placement form as normal but use the dates you have been given by the employer.

- If you are planning to work with someone who is self-employed, they may not have the necessary insurances for us to agree to the placement.
- If this happens, your parent or carer will need to say whether they are happy for you to take part, acknowledging the lack of insurance.
