Dear Parents/carers

Although I seem to be saying this in every weekly letter lately, it has been another very busy week here. Year 11 students are now back in lessons following their mock period and attention is clearly turning to their next steps. We had a number of students attend the Careers Sector Fair on Tuesday afternoon and it was pleasing to hear about the very complimentary comments from the external visitors. Mizzymead Road Parking and Drop Off

We are now approaching the end of the first year of the front gate being closed for 10 minutes at the start and end of the school day. As long-standing parents will know, this decision was taken to reduce the risk of harm to both staff and students given the noticeable increase in traffic that was coming onto site at the same time as 1200 students were being dismissed. As a school we already have 8 North Somerset SUVs that drop off and pick up students as their transport is provided by the local authority. With these on site there is simply not the space and therefore there is too much risk in allowing more vehicles onto site at these times. We really appreciate parents/carers understanding and adhering to this arrangement.

One knock on effect of this has been that parents are choosing to drop off students on Mizzymead Road. With staff manning the gate every morning it has been noted that the choice of drop off location has often caused problems for other drivers and there have been some near misses between cars colliding. Thanks in advance for considering the safety of all pedestrians and other road users at the start of the school day.

Christmas Fair

Exam Certificate collection – 4pm- 6pm on Thursday 18th December

Students who picked up their GCSE and Level 3 results in August have the opportunity to come and collect the official certificates sent by the exam board before the Christmas break.

Exam certificates are valuable as they are your only proof of your achievements and they are expensive to replace. Each certificate costs around £60.00 to replace and are only available from the Exam Boards, not from the School Exams Office. With this in mind, we ask you to collect your certificates and sign for them as proof that they have been received. As we require a signature, we cannot post them to you. In order to protect your certificates, it is advisable for you to photocopy them and keep them somewhere safe where they will not get lost. Please come to the school reception on the above date where you will then be asked to sign for them. If you would prefer a family member to collect your certificates on your behalf, please complete the form downloadable from the website Microsoft Word - Certificate Collection 2023 Your nominated person must bring this signed form with them if they wish to collect.

Wellspring Listening Service

Sometimes teenagers need someone to talk to outside of their friends and family group. Wellspring offer a Listening Mentor service for young people aged 11-15 to chat, and to feel heard and supported. This is not counselling, just an opportunity to talk through whatever is on their mind without pressure or judgement. The service is free, easy to access, virtually no waiting list and confidential.
