Re-set and Refresh

We have now come to the end of the first week of our Timeout system at breaktime and lunchtime. As you may remember from last week's letter students are sent here if they are running inside the building, shouting/swearing or seen pushing/shoving/placing hands on other students. The aim is to ensure that break and lunch times are calm whilst also providing those important opportunities of seeing friends.

Students have also responded positively to the additional benches purchased for the atrium. To continue to respond to the increased number of students in school, we are planning to purchase a further ten and they should be in place by the end of this term.

Signage in toilet areas, reminding students that these should not be a place for loitering, has also had a positive impact. These changes were made in direct response from student voice who commented that students who were gathering there were often preventing others from using the facilities.

In another response to student voice comments and looking ahead to the changes in government legislation in relation to school uniform, we have also received samples of a new polo shirt that could be introduced. These will be shared with School Captains and Student Council ahead of a wider consultation in the next few weeks. We will then share the plans of how Nailsea will be compliant with the new legislation. Further updates will follow in due course.

Next week we are having a renewed focus on corridor etiquette to ease movement around the building in a safe way. Teaching staff are regularly stood at the doorways welcoming students and sending students on their way at the start and end of lessons. Whilst there, and when staff are moving around the site the following expectations are being relaunched and re-enforced:

- Students keep left when walking down corridors. No more than two students/a pair walk side by side in the corridors to enable ease of movement in both directions.
- Students keep left when using stairwells. On stairwells, students should ascend and descend the stairs in single file to ensure this can be done safely and swiftly.

These messages will be shared with students in tutor time next week and it is envisaged that this practice is fully embedded by the end of this term.
