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Uniform Reminder Key Dates Term 1 In my final letter of term 6 I did include a section on uniform expectations. Naturally, I want to avoid the school being at odds with any student as this is a negative start to the term for all concerned. I would like to take this opportunity to remind families of our expectations and ask **Tues 24th Sept** for parents to support the school: DofE Awards Evening, **Shoes:** Plain black sensible leather look shoes. No boots or canvas shoes. 6:30-7:30pm **Trousers:** No jeans or leggings. No visible zips/buttons/fashion accessory belts. Ankles should not be visible. Jumper: The only jumper students should wear whilst in school is the Nailsea Thurs 26th Sept School jumper. Hoodies and other jumpers are not permitted and should be removed on entering the building. Failure to do so will mean they are confiscated. Open Evening, 6pm **Coats:** Outdoor coats should not be worn in the building. These should be stored Please note school in lockers at the start of the school day. Failure to do so will mean they are confiscated. starts at 9:40 am on Fri Jewellery: One pair of small, plain studs or sleeper size earrings and a watch are 27th Sept the only items allowed. Hooped earrings must not be worn. All Jewellery must be removed for PE activities and is brought into school entirely at the student's own risk. No facial piercings are permitted. Sun 29th Sept Make Up: Students will be required to remove any excessive make up. Nail varnish is not allowed and students will be asked to remove this. 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Parental Communication: FAQs

Communication between home and school is highly valued at Nailsea as a way to support students in being happy. Happy students make the most progress. As a reminder here are some frequently asked questions about methods of communication and who to contact when.

When should I contact school?

If in doubt, please contact us; we would rather you contacted us for reassurance over something that turns out to be minor than spend time worrying about something.

I know class teachers are busy. Is it ok to contact them?

Of course this is fine. We only ask that you respect the fact that most teachers teach around 150 students and cannot, therefore, realistically enter into detailed dialogue over a prolonged period of time with individual parents. Please feel free to use email in the first instance. Please note that as part of school policy it is not expected that teachers will reply to messages outside of work hours. Ordinarily, though, you should expect a response within 48 hours.

Can't I just contact the Head if I've got a problem?

Yes, you are always welcome to contact the Head if you feel you need to either directly or through the school reception. At the same time it may be appropriate for another member of staff who has more detailed knowledge of the issue to respond in the first instance.

In addition Mrs Elliott holds her 'Open Door Parent Clinics' on most Wednesday afternoons during term time for parents to speak directly with her regarding any concerns or suggestions they may have.

Who are the best people to contact?

The table overleaf is intended to help parents with information about who to contact in certain common scenarios. If you are unsure of who to contact, we recommend you call the main school reception on 01275 852251 where our staff can point you in the right direction.

We always try our best to solve issues if and when they arise. We also understand that parents/carers may be frustrated about issues when the occur. At the same time our staff should not have to tolerate communication that is abrasive or aggressive. Equally we would much prefer parents or carers contact us directly with concerns rather than raise them on social media before we have had the chance to respond.
