## **Mobile phone reminder**

As per our school policy mobile phones should be 'off and away for the whole school day'. Staff are aware that for journeys to and from school having a way to contact students is a way to ensure their safety. However, if a phone is seen being used during the hours of the school day this will be confiscated. Repeat incidents of confiscation could lead to parents having to collect the phone, as opposed to the student collecting it at the end of the school day.

If parents need to contact their child during the school day we would ask that they make contact through the main reception where a message can easily be passed on. As you can appreciate, using a text message is encouraging students not to adhere to this very clear expectation in checking their phones.

In addition to mobile phones, can I also remind parents that headphones are also not permitted to be worn during the school day, unless explicit permission has been given by subject staff in a lesson.

## Summer Exam Period 2019

For those students who are due to complete external examinations in 2019, I am aware that it is always useful to know when the exam period has been concluded. This is usually the case for families that wish to book summer holidays. The final GCSE exam nationally will be held on 18th June and the final GCE exam on the 23rd June. Students' individual timetables will be finalised in due course and will, naturally, be dependent on the courses and exam boards that each subject and students follow.

However, the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ) have introduced a contingency date for any exams that have to be rearranged by the boards for any reason in the summer season 2019. They have identified this year's exam contingency date as **Wednesday 24th June 2020**. In theory this means that all students should be available for that date in case any of their exams need to be rearranged.

For this reason, irrespective of which subjects and courses students are following, families should be aware that no holidays should be booked that would prevent any candidate attending an exam on 24th June if this date needs to be used.

Thank you for taking this into consideration when booking family holidays.

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
