Positive Post

Last week saw the launch of our 'Positive Post' Scheme which was introduced to students in assemblies.

Visitors to the school may have noticed the post box that has been put in place in reception and this is now being checked every fortnight by Mrs Elliott to see which students or staff are recipients of one of our 'Positive Post' cards.

Cards are awarded to those students or staff that have been noted as embodying our school ethos, 'Aspire Believe Succeed', with each of the cards giving examples of how this may have been achieved.

As well as receiving the card from the nominee, the recipients also receive a covering letter from Mrs Elliott and 25 house points to be added to both their individual and house totals—a figure that can certainly make a difference to students qualifying for termly rewards events and for the House Championship.

There are 3 of the cards to collect and Mrs Elliott has an, undisclosed, additional prize for those students who are then awarded the full set.

It was great to be able to send 6 cards home last week. External visitors to the school can also nominate students and staff by picking up and posting a card. These can be found in main reception.



Duke of Edinburgh Scheme



As a school the numbers of students that are signing up for the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme is continuing to rise with over 60 students signing up for the Bronze certificate in the last couple of weeks—almost double that of the year before.

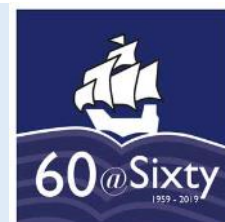

Car Access on Site

There are a restricted number of students, for a variety of reasons, that have permission from the school to drop students at main reception and collect at the end of the school day. With the change in weather recently it has been noted that more parents have been dropping students at the front of the school without this prior agreement. This increased traffic has meant that on occasions there have been some 'near misses', with both cars and individuals almost being hit.
