This week, as we move into the half term break, we have finally (all be it briefly) been reminded what the sun looks like. Here's hoping that the week away from school over the break is one where we can all enjoy some time outside whilst resting and recharging.

Changes ahead of Term 6

There are a couple of things I would like to highlight as with year 11 leaving there have been some changes to the inside social areas for year 10 and the outside social areas for students. These include:

- **Yr 7:** Continued access to canteen and the outdoor space is now at the rear of the school, access through the door on the Yr 7 corridor.
- **Yr 8:** Continued access to indoor space but now have access to larger parts of the school field as well as the courtyard seating area at the back of the school.
- **Yr 9:** Continued access to all of the outdoor space at the front of the school. Their indoor space will remain the same (part of the atrium, media steps and media cafe).
- **Yr 10:** They will now be accessing the Juice bar and not the GLT inside. They will be occupying the outdoor space left by yr11 (top part of the field as well as the grass area by the 4G).

In line with national guidance students are remaining in bubbles and will continue to use their existing entrances to the building. From Term 6, year 10 students will enter and exit the building through the Juice Bar and no longer come through main reception. Students can access this entrance from Mizzymeard Road by walking alongside and around the Dance Studio and the Sports Hall.

Breaktimes will revert to being 20 minutes and lunchtimes will return to 40 minutes. This means that the timings of the school day for Term 6 are as follows:

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Ofqual open consultation for arrangements for non-exam assessment in 2022

Ofqual are seeking views on their proposal to carry forward changes agreed for summer 2021 for some subjects, to take account of any public health restrictions relating to COVID-19 that might be in place during the next academic year. This consultation therefore applies to students in current year 10 and 12.

This consultation covers:

- non-exam assessments in dance, design and technology, drama (and theatre), film studies, food preparation and nutrition, media studies, music, music technology, and physical education (PE)
- fieldwork activities in geography, geology and environmental science
- assessment of speaking skills in GCSE modern foreign languages (MFL)
- assessment of spoken language in GCSE English language

Finally...


