The last day of term will be Wednesday 21st July.

The day will run as follows:

8:40 - 9:35 - Period 1

11:45 - 12:20pm - Lunch

12:20 - 12:30pm - Tutor time

Students will be dismissed by their tutor at 12:30pm to leave for the summer break. If your child uses transport provided by the school they have been informed about the changes to the timings of the school day in advance.

### **Litter on site**

We are incredibly lucky to have the facilities we have at Nailsea and so it is always slightly disappointing when students appear to be taking these for granted.

Over the last fortnight many students would have seen me out and about with a litter picker at lunchtime and there have, sadly, been large amounts of litter collected in all the year group areas.

What is even more disappointing is the reaction of some students to me doing this. When spoken to about the litter, which can only have been dropped by that group given the separate bubbles, I have received comments such as 'It's not my rubbish' and 'Why can't you pay someone to do this?'. These do not sit well with the ethos of #teamnailsea. Some students, I have to say, have been proactive and helped with the collection and depositing of the litter in bins whilst I have been there, for which I have thanked them.

As custodian of the site and the facilities for the time being, I do have high expectations of how the buildings and grounds should be treated and feel it is important that we all have a social and collective responsibility to protect them. I would really appreciate it if you could re-enforce this message from home. Thank you, in advance, for your support on this matter.

### **Students using school transport**

As per our risk assessment students who travel on school based transport are still required to wear face masks until the end of term. This is in line with the guidance distributed where it was stated schools can continue with existing measures until the end of the academic year. Thank you, in advance, for continuing to ensure your son/daughter wears a face mask on this transport.

### **Start of term arrangements – September 2021**

As a reminder the academic year will start for students in years 7, 8 and 12 on 8<sup>th</sup> September 2021. The additional day will aid with the transition process.

You will shortly receive a separate communication regarding the on site testing arrangements that are also required for students in September. Appointment times for these tests that will be held from 6<sup>th</sup> September will be distributed next week.

This was due to national rules around self-isolation; however, I am proud that we continued to keep any risk to your child to a minimum and prioritised health and safety throughout. Students who attended school, when they could, and engaged with remote learning when necessary have made massive strides in their learning and we are committed to continuing on the path to filling any gaps that may have occurred as a result of factors that were beyond our control.
