



Remote Learning at Nailsea School

This plan outlines the three types of Remote Learning which will be offered to students if their learning is disrupted by Covid between September 2021 – July 2022. It is not anticipated that there will be a return to whole school closures nationally and class closures will be a last resort (see Covid Contingency Plan Sept 2021). However, it is likely that some children will have to miss school because they have asymptomatic Covid. It is also possible that, should there be a major Covid outbreak within school, whole classes may have to move to home learning for 10 school days. If your child is ill with Covid, or any other illness, they won't be expected to complete any home learning. There are three different types of home learning available:

Who is this for?	This is for individual students who can't attend school because they have Covid, but don't have symptoms so can continue to access learning at home during isolation.	This is for whole classes who have been moved to remote learning for 10 school days because there has been a significant outbreak which continues to spread.	It is not expected that there will be a need to close the whole school as a result of Covid. However, should this be necessary, then this home learning will be provided.
How will learning be structured?
