



How to plan and prepare for KS4 MFL

In MFL, we **Upload, Process** and **Download** our way to successful grades, just like in all other subjects.

These listed strategies are supported by educational research, and are designed to enable you to engage with activities which result in successful outcomes.

- Build your vocabulary and grammar knowledge:
- Create **flashcards** for key vocabulary and verb conjugations.
 - Use your books and revision guides to find high-frequency words and grammar rules.
 - Include example sentences using vocab in context.
 - Use platforms like **Quizlet, Memrise or Blooket**.
 - Listen to topic-based audio to train your ear.

- Turn knowledge into skills:
- Practise **listening and reading** tasks regularly.
 - Use the **Leitner Box method** to revise flashcards.
 - Write example sentences and paragraphs using your vocab.
 - Speak aloud often - practise pronunciation with recordings or friends.
 - Do grammar drills (e.g. verb tables, sentence reordering).

- Now put your knowledge into practice with **exam-style tasks**:
- **Listening** – Do past paper questions and practise transcribing short clips.
 - **Reading** – Answer comprehension questions and translate short texts into English.
 - **Speaking** – Record answers to photo card and conversation questions. Time yourself and aim for 3 tenses + opinions.
 - **Writing** – Practise 90- and 150-word tasks. Use model answers to improve.
 - **Translation** – Translate both ways (English ↔ Target Language) and check for natural phrasing.
